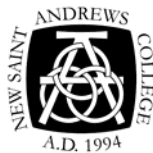

New Saint Andrews College Application for Admission

You're invited. Apply yourself!

Thank you for your interest in New Saint Andrews College.

The College seeks students who confess Jesus Christ as Lord and who desire to make every academic subject and every area of their lives captive to Christ.

As a classical Christian liberal arts college, we admit students who are eager to immerse themselves in theology, philosophy, history, classical languages, rhetoric, science, literature, music, and the arts.

As a college committed to the



reformational vision of evangelical Protestantism, we look for students who will devote themselves to a rigorous course of readings in pursuit of biblical truth, goodness, and beauty, while confronting the pivotal issues of Western culture from a biblical worldview. Our

unique program requires that students possess personal, intellectual, and spiritual maturity, and exhibit those qualities of mind and heart expected of those who name the name of the Lord of lords and King of kings.

Application Process Overview

To initiate your application, return the Application Form (the first four pages of forms) and the requisite application fee. Then follow up with the supplemental information required for the level of enrollment you indicate on the form (matriculating, non-matriculating or auditor).

The following supplemental

information can be submitted at a later date, but will need to be received before your file will be recommended to the Admission Committee.

As an applicant, you are either a **matriculating student** (full or part-time student pursuing a degree), a **non-matriculating student** (taking classes for credit but not pursuing a degree)

or an **auditor** (attending classes but not participating in discussion or assignments).

Based on your desired level of enrollment, you may be required to fulfill all or some of the following supplementary information requirements. See the chart below.

I. Essays

Statement of Christian Faith

The Admissions Committee is not looking for a theological treatise, but a concise statement of the applicant's Christian beliefs in 250 words or less.

Students are not required to subscribe to the College's Statement of Faith, but they should indicate what they believe with regard to basic Christian doctrine. All students who attend New Saint Andrews must pledge in writing to maintain sound Christian doctrine, to regularly attend an orthodox church, and to maintain a teachable spirit. Students should give attention not only to what they write, but how they write it.

Students who have any questions about the College's Student Code of Conduct or the student pledge regarding sound doctrine should contact the College for more information.

Essay on Why You Wish to Attend New Saint Andrews College

In 250 words or less, the Admissions Committee wants to know how serious a student is about attending the College and how well the student will fit in with the other Christian scholars in our community. Because New Saint Andrews admits only 50-60 full-time first-

year students annually, each new student is an important addition to the character and culture of the College.

The Committee tries to identify applicants whose educational goals and interests will be best served by the College, and whose presence will be a positive addition to the College. The Committee encourages applicants to explain why they think New Saint Andrews meets their specific academic and personal goals, and why they think they will benefit from the College's programs.

Copy of an Essay Previously Submitted for Academic Credit

The Admissions Committee has found that copies of previously graded academic work are helpful in assessing an applicant's rhetorical skills. Because these abilities are so important for academic success at New Saint Andrews, applicants are encouraged to provide an example of what they consider their best work. The essay must be the student's work alone, and preference is given to original copies of essays graded by a parent or teacher. The essay may be on any subject and in any style of writing, but it should be an example of what the student considers his or her best academic work.

II. Transcripts and Test Scores

Satisfactory Completion of Secondary Education

Successful applicants typically average "B" or better grades in their general secondary-level studies. The Admissions Committee gives careful attention to an applicant's record in English, languages, history, and social studies in order to assess the student's ability to meet the College's significant reading and writing requirements. Previous Latin and classical studies are not required, but they may prove helpful

in demonstrating a student's ability and commitment to pursuing the College's classical curriculum.

Home schooled applicants should provide evidence of completion of secondary-level studies by submitting GED scores or other record of academic assessment, such as a full transcript of courses completed, including grades earned, date of graduation or completion and/or narrative evaluation of performance.

A Note to Transfer Students

New Saint Andrews welcomes applications from prospective students who have completed post-secondary-level coursework at other colleges or universities and who wish to pursue a bachelor's degree at New Saint Andrews.

The integrative and intensive nature of the New Saint Andrews curriculum usually allows a limited number of transfer credits or course equivalencies from other colleges and universities.

The College accepts transfer course equivalencies only for courses completed with a grade of "B" or better. The College accepts no transfer course equivalencies or credits for students entering its two-year Associate of Arts program.

Applicants transferring from other institutions must request that official transcripts of all their prior college-level coursework be sent directly to the New Saint Andrews Admissions Office.

A Note to International Students

International students whose native language is other than English must achieve either a score of at least 570 on the paper-based Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and 4.5 on the Test of Written English (TWE), or a score of at least 230 on the computer-based TOEFL with a 4.5 minimum on the essay portion of the exam.

Application Requirements in Detail, continued

Standardized Examination Scores (ACT or SAT)

The College uses these standardized tests as one way (among several) to identify an applicant's areas of academic strength and weakness. The College has found these tests to be generally reliable indicators of future academic success at the undergraduate level, but the Admissions Committee never considers them apart from the context of the student's overall academic record and application portfolio.

The College requires a composite score of 20 or higher on the ACT, or 1000 or higher on the SAT (Math + Critical Reading). At this point we encourage prospective students to complete the writing portion of the SAT, however we primarily look at the Critical Reading and Math sections.

It is only these two sections that are counted towards the 1,000 composite, as our Application includes several essays that are used to determine the writing capabilities of an applicant. Students who score below the required minimums may still be admitted on a provisional basis and given the opportunity to demonstrate their academic abilities during one academic term.

III. Evaluations

Pastoral Evaluation

The Admissions Committee considers confidential pastoral evaluations very seriously. These evaluations provide non-academic indicators of basic personal, familial, social, and spiritual traits that are essential to the Committee's assessment of how well a student will fit in at New Saint Andrews. When a pastoral evaluation seems to contradict other evidence in the

applicant's portfolio, the Admissions Committee may contact the pastor and/or the applicant directly to seek additional information and clarification.

The applicants are responsible for contacting their pastors and requesting that they fill out the Pastoral Evaluation Form. The completed pastoral evaluation form must be returned directly to the College and should not be returned by the applicant.

Academic Evaluation

The Admissions Committee values the confidential academic evaluations of educators who know the applicant well. These evaluations provide academic indicators that are essential to the Committee's assessment of how well a student will fit in at New Saint Andrews. When an academic evaluation seems to contradict other evidence in the applicant's portfolio, the Admissions Committee may contact the teacher/advisor and/or the applicant directly to seek additional information and clarification. The applicants are responsible for contacting their teachers/advisors and requesting that they fill out the Academic Evaluation Form. The completed academic evaluation form must be returned directly to the College and should not be returned by the applicant.

Statement of Financial Commitment and Disclosure

Because the College limits its enrollment, the Admissions Committee wants to know whether applicants can meet their financial obligations so it does not displace qualified applicants who are able to pay.

The point is not to pry into your personal financial records, but to simply receive personal assurance that you will be able to meet your financial obligations to the College if accepted and that you are willing to take responsibility for this commitment.

Feb. 15

REGULAR DEADLINE

The College's regular deadline for applications is February 15 with a fee of \$40.

May 1

LATE APPLICATIONS

Applications received after the February 15th deadline are considered late, but will be accepted until May 1 with a \$50 fee. Applicants who wish to apply after May 1 should contact the Admissions Office by phone (208-882-1566) or email (admissions@nsa.edu) to determine whether space is still available for the coming academic year.

International Students whose native language is other than English must achieve either a score of at least 570 on the paper-based Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) and 4.5 on the Test of Written English (TWE), or a score of at least 230 on the computer-based TOEFL with a 4.5 minimum on the essay portion of the exam. New Saint Andrews College will issue the Certificate of Eligibility for Nonimmigrant Student Status (INS Form I-20) to students from outside the United States who meet both the admissions and language requirements. International applicants must also provide an official letter from bank officials verifying that the applicant has sufficient funds on deposit to meet the costs of tuition, fees, books, and living expenses for one full academic year. Please inquire with the Bursar to obtain the appropriate amount. International students need to apply by February 15 with a US \$50 fee and submit all required application materials by no later than May 1.

Tuition and Financial Information

New Saint Andrews is committed to keeping the cost of tuition as low as possible for our students and their families. Students who save the most apply early, commit themselves to attending full-time, pay their tuition in full by July 1, and take advantage of the College's unique fixed tuition option.

Tuition Amount

Tuition at New Saint Andrews is roughly one-third the average cost of private colleges and universities nationally. For this year's tuition amount, please consult our web site at www.nsa.edu.

Tuition Lock Program

The College is unique in offering full-time freshmen the opportunity to lock in their first year's tuition rate for up to five consecutive academic years.

The Tuition Lock Program assures participants of tuition savings in an amount at least equal to the amount of the lock fee. Students also have the potential to realize tuition savings in an amount up to three times the amount of the lock fee.

Full-time Tuition

A student's tuition agreement and accompanying confirmation deposit must be received by the posted deadline, and tuition paid in full by July 1.

Payment Plan Option

The payment plan (which includes a financing fee of 10 percent) allows tuition to be paid in five equal installments, payable at the beginning of July, September, November, January and March.

Tuition for Part-time Students

Part-time tuition is paid per course per term, due in full the first day of each term. Auditor's fees are also paid per

course per term due in full the first day of each term.

International Students

International applicants must also provide an official letter from bank officials verifying that the applicant has sufficient funds on deposit to meet the costs of tuition, fees, books, and living expenses for one full academic year. Please inquire with the Bursar to obtain the appropriate amount. International students need to apply by February 15 with a US \$50 fee and submit all required application materials by no later than May 1.

Scholarships

As funds permit, the College offers need-based and merit scholarships. To protect the religious integrity and freedom of our Christian institution, the College does not participate, on principle, with any government-sponsored financial aid programs. Instead, a private scholarship organization is available to provide assistance to needy and deserving students.

Students interested in scholarships from the Paideia Scholarship Fund should notify the College's admissions officer.

Applicants in need of financial assistance should indicate their interest in scholarships in their Financial Commitment Disclosure and submit their completed application forms and materials no later than the February 15 deadline to be eligible for scholarships and financial aid consideration.

Merit Recognition

Students who achieve the highest levels of academic accomplishment at the secondary level are recognized as Saint Andrews Scholars. In addition to this recognition, these students are eligible for financial awards when available, typically ranging from \$1,000 to the full

tuition amount. The College's Presidential Scholarship is reserved for the most distinguished of Saint Andrews Scholars, recognizing outstanding academic achievement and Christian character. These awards range from \$2,500 to the full tuition amount. As with the need-based scholarship, the availability of merit-based scholarships is dependent upon available funding.

Institutional Scholarships

The *ACCS Alumni Scholarship* is a \$1,000 scholarship available to first-time college freshmen who graduate from an Association of Classical & Christian Schools member school and are accepted and enroll at New Saint Andrews immediately following high school graduation.

The *ACCS Educators Scholarship* is a \$2,000 scholarship available to first-time college freshmen who have at least one parent who is a full-time teacher (with at least five years of full-time ACCS experience) at an ACCS-member school and are accepted and enroll at New Saint Andrews immediately following high school graduation.

Other need-based financial assistance is available from the College on a limited basis, including the *Jan-Louis du Plooy Scholarship* for orphans and children of widowed parents and the *Joyce Gray Memorial Scholarship* for students with *bona fide* financial need.

Applicants must respond to all sections of the Financial Commitment Disclosure form for consideration.

Scholarship Deadline

For priority consideration for freshman scholarships and financial assistance, prospective students must submit their applications and materials by the February 15 deadline.

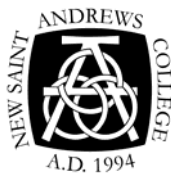
