The Association of Reformed Institutions of Higher Education (arihe.org) invites you to submit papers and proposals for consideration for presentation at its Symposium on Pedagogy hosted by New Saint Andrews College in Moscow, Idaho, September 15-17, 2011. Individual paper presentations, poster sessions presentations, and panel presentations may be included in the program on a competitive basis. Papers and presentation proposals should be appropriate to the Symposium's theme and focus on pedagogy, and may cover a wide range of relevant topics, such as:

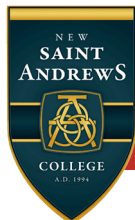
- The Implications of Christian Students being Royal Heirs of the King of Kings (I Peter 2:9, Rev. 1:6)
- Reformed Theories and Perspectives on Pedagogy
- Biblical and Theological Issues in Pedagogy
- Best Practices for Teaching Specific Subjects or Disciplines
- The History of Reformed Pedagogy
- Service Learning and Pedagogy Beyond the Classroom
- Creative or Non-Traditional Approaches to Pedagogy
- Graduate and Professional Pedagogy

Guidelines for Submitting a Paper or Presentation Proposal:

To submit a paper or proposal on pedagogy for consideration for presentation at the ARIHE 2011 Symposium to be held at New Saint Andrews College, September 15-17, please follow the guidelines below:

1. Submit all materials in MSWord or PDF format.
2. A complete paper (limited to approximately 20 pages in length maximum, excluding endnotes) or detailed presentation proposal must be submitted in digital form only as an attached file by email. Contact Dr. Jonathan McIntosh (jmcintosh@nsa.edu), Symposium Paper Coordinator for acceptance of papers after June 15.
3. Include with the completed paper or detailed presentation proposal an abstract or executive summary of no more than 150 words suitable for use in the Symposium program, if accepted.
4. On a separate page, provide the following information: author(s)/ presenter(s) name(s), institutional affiliation(s), mailing address(es), telephone number(s), and email address(es).
5. The title should be printed on the first page of the text and on running heads on each page of text, as well as on the title page, but do NOT include any author or presenter's name on the running heads or title page.
6. Papers and presentation proposals should not have been previously published, presented, or be under review for publication or presentation at other conferences.
7. Student papers are welcome, but because of limited space in the Symposium program, they will compete on an equal footing with all other papers and proposals.
8. By submitting a paper or proposal, authors affirm their bona fide commitment to attend the Symposium and to present the paper as submitted.
9. Authors of accepted papers and proposals must be paid registrants for the Symposium by no later than August 15 or their paper's acceptance status may be revoked and omitted from the official Symposium program.
10. Notification of paper and proposal acceptances will be made by about August 1. Authors who not been notified by August 1, may contact the Symposium coordinator for more information.
